**ORDER AWARDING SANCTIONS TO HONEYWELL
INTERNATIONAL INC. AND HONEYWELL INTELLECTUAL PROPERTIES INC.**

WHEREAS, on November 25, 2008, the Court ordered sanctions against InnoLux Display Corporation (“InnoLux”) for its conduct at the Fed. R. Civ. P. 30(b)(6) deposition (“30(b)(6) deposition”) of Katherine Liang on September 30, 2008, granting Honeywell International Inc. and Honeywell Intellectual Properties Inc.’s (“Honeywell”) request to retake the 30(b)(6) deposition of InnoLux as part of jurisdictional discovery and requiring InnoLux to bear the costs associated with Honeywell retaking the 30(b)(6) deposition of InnoLux (D.I. 481);

WHEREAS, on February 13, 2009, InnoLux withdrew its Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(2) defense for lack of personal jurisdiction, thus obviating the need for a continued 30(b)(6) deposition as part of jurisdictional discovery;

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2009, Honeywell filed a Motion for Assessment of Attorneys’ Fees and Costs requesting (1) \$22,000 associated with bringing its October 6, 2008 motion to compel (D.I. 372), (2) \$5,931.56 associated with the actual costs incurred by Honeywell for the 30(b)(6) deposition of Katherine Liang taken on September 30, 2008, (3) a minimum of \$4,860.00 for five hours of preparation and seven hours for taking the 30(b)(6) deposition of

Katherine Liang at a rate of \$405.00 per hour, and (4) such other relief as the Court deems just and proper (D.I. 641);

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2009, InnoLux filed a brief in opposition to Honeywell's Motion for Assessment of Attorneys' Fees and Costs (D.I. 649);


WHEREAS, on April 30, 2009, Honeywell filed a Reply to InnoLux's Opposition of Honeywell's Motion for Assessment of Attorneys' Fees and Costs (D.I. 650);

WHEREAS, Honeywell and InnoLux have reached an agreement that the amount of sanctions awarded to Honeywell that will be paid by InnoLux will be \$18,000.00;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:


1. Honeywell is awarded sanctions in the amount of \$18,000.00;
2. InnoLux is to pay full the amount of sanctions awarded to Honeywell to Robins, Kaplan, Miller & Ciresi LLP, counsel for Honeywell, within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Order.
